Unlocking insights for a Vibrant Downtown

This year, we welcomed Placer AI, a cutting-edge location analytics platform, into our downtown toolkit. Thanks to a partnership with the Cedar Rapids Metro Economic Alliance and the MedQuarter SSMID, this powerful tool enables us to collaborate and take action on patron traffic trends. By understanding visit patterns, trade areas, and demographics, we can create experiences and initiatives that resonate with our community, driving growth and vibrancy across downtown districts. Together, we're leveraging data to enhance the vitality of Cedar Rapids.

In addition to its many capabilities, Placer AI has provided key insights that reveal downtown traffic has returned to pre-pandemic levels—signaling that life is truly coming back to our city center. This data also highlighted the success of the 2024 Cedar Rapids Downtown Farmers Market, which continues to thrive, drawing large crowds and supporting local businesses. It's clear that downtown Cedar Rapids is experiencing a vibrant resurgence, and we're excited to build on this momentum.



Downtown Foot Traffic in 2024

Placer.ai data has been instrumental in helping Downtown understand how traffic in 2024 has compared to pre-pandemic levels. Employees Downtown are back at 72% of pre-pandemic levels. Visits are 94% of what they were before the pandemic hit, and visitors are up over 100%!







Exciting New Additions to Downtown Cedar Rapids

2024 brought a wave of new businesses and restaurants to downtown Cedar Rapids, further enhancing our city's energy and appeal. Notable newcomers like City Walk Eatery, Studio 6, Lush Beauty Bar, and The District CR are adding fresh experiences for both residents and visitors. Dining spots like Big Grove and Pickle Palace have become standout additions, playing a key role in the success of Kingston Yard, the newly developed space on the other side of the river. Their presence is driving traffic and interest to downtown, making it an even more dynamic destination. Meanwhile, Amor Pizza continues to grow its presence in the heart of downtown.

Additionally, community-focused businesses such as UnityPoint Health's Abbe Health Center and Stamats have expanded into downtown, further strengthening the district's appeal. With creative spaces like 3rd St. Market, The Studio, and TRU Nightclub, downtown continues to thrive with new opportunities and experiences. These additions not only contribute to the area's economic growth but also make downtown a more exciting and engaging place to live, work, and explore.

Illuminating Downtown: The Facade Improvement Program

The Downtown Façade Improvement Program continues to play a pivotal role in enhancing the appearance and functionality of downtown Cedar Rapids. Designed to encourage property and business owners to renovate building exteriors visible to the public, this program promotes high-quality improvements that add visual appeal and inspire further investments in the district.

This year, the Foundation 2 and Sokol Building received funding through the program, joining a growing list of

projects that have brightened downtown with impactful renovations. Recent efforts have emphasized exterior lighting, transforming buildings like Cedar River Tower, Theatre Cedar Rapids, and the Arco building into vibrant beacons that energize the streetscape and create a welcoming atmosphere for residents and visitors alike. Co-funded by the Downtown SSMID Commission and the City of Cedar Rapids, the program is a testament to the collaborative efforts driving the district's continued growth and revitalization.



This is Downtown

Downtown Cedar Rapids now greets visitors and residents with bold new signage in several areas of the city. The newest addition sits high in the city skyline on the Five Seasons Parking Garage. The "Welcome to Downtown Cedar Rapids" sign creates an inviting first impression, reinforcing the area's identity as a dynamic and welcoming destination in a high traffic area of the city's core.

Beyond this key addition, increased branding efforts have amplified downtown's visibility across multiple touchpoints on both sides of the river. New signage in Kingston Village strengthens the district's identity on the Kingston Village side, while branding support on outdoor igloos that live at Big Grove Brewery extends the downtown experience in creative and engaging ways on a smaller basis. These efforts work together to enhance Cedar Rapids' presence, ensuring that downtown remains a vibrant, recognizable, and thriving hub for all who visit, work, and live in the community.

Downtown social media pages aim to provide "social proof" for the district's efforts. They generate publicity and create excitement for news, initiatives and all-things downtown happenings. News about events, new businesses, and internal changes are also touched on. Highlighting Downtown's people has been massively successful. Pictures of the downtown maintenance team in action and the announcement of new hires always creates engaging waves. Images of the Downtown area, activities, and history show that the digital community prefers to engage with visually driven content.

The timelier the content, the better the return on engagement. When downtown is at the forefront of breaking news, it is more likely to be shared not only on social media, but in traditional media as well. The best example of this was the Trolley Pilot announcement, which was shared not only by influential figures in the community, but by media outlets like the Gazette and Corridor Business Journal.

This premier statewide gathering brought together professionals and volunteers dedicated to downtown revitalization.

The conference provided invaluable opportunities to network, share insights, and explore strategies that stimulate economic activity in commercial districts. Attendees participated in engaging plenary sessions, breakout discussions, and interactive tours showcasing the vibrancy of downtown Cedar Rapids. The event highlighted emerging trends in placemaking and economic development, equipping communities with fresh ideas and practical

tools to enhance their own downtown districts. Hosting this prestigious event reinforced Cedar Rapids' position as a leader in downtown innovation while giving visitors a firsthand experience of the energy and momentum shaping our city's future.

Downtown Vision Plan

As 2024 comes to a close, Downtown Cedar Rapids reflects on a year filled with impactful initiatives and successful milestones that have contributed to its vibrancy and growth. The progress made throughout the year was made possible by an incredible team dedicated to enhancing the downtown experience.

The Downtown District allocated its full event sponsorship budget of \$65,000 in 2024, funding ten outdoor events and twenty-five live music performances at various downtown bars and restaurants. While total sponsorship requests reached \$74,775, every available dollar was strategically distributed to enrich community engagement and increase foot traffic. These sponsorships played a pivotal role in solidifying Downtown Cedar Rapids as a premier destination for entertainment and culture in the state.

Beautification efforts also saw significant progress. Floral and greenery arrangements remained in place through early October and fall foliage were successfully tested in select planters at Economic Alliance and Ground Transportation Center. Twelve additional self-watering planters were purchased, bringing the total to twenty-four, while more than twenty outdated cement planters were removed. In collaboration with the City, a sustainable plan was established to maintain planters along 3rd Avenue moving forward.

To further improve cleanliness and sustainability, Downtown Cedar Rapids partnered with Big Belly to add ten more high-tech waste receptacles, increasing the total number of receptacles to fifty. This investment has played a crucial role in maintaining a clean and welcoming environment.

Looking ahead to 2025, the Downtown Vision Plan will continue to serve as a guiding framework for progress. By elevating Downtown's appeal through continued event programming, enhanced beautification projects, and activation of key spaces, the district aims to build on the momentum of 2024, creating even more opportunities for growth, engagement and community pride.

A key focus for 2025 will be the revitalization of Mays Island, transforming it into a vibrant gathering space. Whether serving as a scenic spot for employees to enjoy lunch, a destination for visitors to take in views of the Cedar River, or a venue for community groups to host outdoor events, Mays Island will become an activated hub of downtown life.

In addition to enhancing public spaces, Downtown Cedar Rapids is committed to addressing vacancies through the Race for the Space initiative, which will see it's iteration in 2025. In collaboration with the Economic Alliance and other key partners in the entrepreneurial ecosystem, this effort is strategically positioning new and expanding businesses for long-term success. Big things to come in the years ahead.

The continued collaboration with local businesses, community partners, and stakeholders is vital to driving Downtown Cedar Rapids' growth, ensuring it remains a dynamic hub for commerce, culture, and connection.
