#### Welcome, Introductions & Call to Order

Klein called the meeting to order at 3:02pm.

## **Consent Agenda/Approval of July Minutes**

Rings noted a revision to be made to the minutes to reflect he was present at the July 23<sup>rd</sup> meeting. With this update being made, Stephan moved to approve the July minutes with Dusek seconding. The July minutes were unanimously approved.

## **Designation of Authorized Signer**

Currently, Ryan is the only check signer. As the incoming Chair, it was felt Hartelt should also be a check signer. Klein moved to approve Hartlet as a designated check signer with Rings seconding. The nomination was unanimously approved.

## Nomination to Fill Stephan's Seat

Stephan has sold Iowa Brewing so he will be rolling off the SSMID. Because this will be his last meeting, Klein and Knutson thanked him for his dedicated service and Stephan thanked Rings for bringing him onto the Board.

Knutson shared a commissioner breakdown highlighting the need for more diverse representation, particularly in retail and small business sectors. The commission is currently 78% male with the balance from the finance, insurance and development sectors. Therefore, the commission and Mayor O'Donnell are recommending Juliette Pae-Corr, owner of Fix Salon in Kingston, as a new commissioner and she will represent small retail, female and a younger demographic. Knutson to confirm Pae-Corr owns her building. Klein moved to approve the nomination of Pae-Corr with Rings seconding. The nomination was unanimously approved.

A new state law requiring training for elected and appointed officials went into effect on July 1<sup>st</sup>. Burg is taking the virtual training. As of now, existing officials don't have to take the training, but thoughts are eventually everyone will be required to do so.

### **Race-for-the-Space Winner**

Dr. Tiffany Carr, with Third Space Create, was the winner of Race-for-the-Space. She thanked the commission for the award, shared her background and presented her concept for creative arts/social space downtown. She is currently working with two SCORE mentors. Carr is finalizing the build-out of the space and will be launching an event schedule soon. She said she's having a pop-up event at Big Grove in the near future. It was mentioned if people wanted to get a feel for what's to come, the Glitter Factory in Des Moines is a good comparison.

#### **Downtown Sidewalks**

Public Works presented plans for downtown sidewalk repairs in the next two to three years. DeKeyser said the current sidewalk system was built in the 1990s, so sidewalks are in need of repair. He explained either the City will do repairs and bill the owners, or the property owners can make repairs themselves. He said the advantage of using the City is they buy in bulk. DeKeyser stated the following:

- City will notify property owners in January 2026, with May 2026 deadline for owner-initiated repairs.
- City will reimburse up to \$1,000 per property for repairs.
- The city's website has a list of city-bonded contractors.
- This is concrete repair only.
- A public information meeting will be held in November.

The commission discussed the need to potentially increase the reimbursement amount for downtown properties with longer sidewalks who as a result, pay more in property tax. Pratt and Knutson are to discuss to see if the \$1000 amount can be increased.

Dusek raised concerns about brick pavers and ensuring proper restoration after repairs with DeKeyser responding they will be using less pavers in the future.

Rings asked if the City would repair anything that was disturbed? The City is going to talk to property owners and mark-up their sidewalks at the same time. This way the property owners won't be surprised by how it is being repaired. Pratt emphasized the City still has to adhere to design standards; therefore, each will be evaluated on a case-by-case basis.

### **PlacerAl Website Updates**

Plans were reviewed for implementing PlacerAI data tracking on the downtown website, which will help monitor visitor traffic and other metrics. Knutson confirmed downtown has returned to pre-COVID levels. Kepros recommended sharing this fact with the media.

Traffic during Farmers Markets was reviewed with Rings asking about the possibility of extending the markets because of nice weather. Wheeler shared the Economic Alliance is discussing options for extending the 2026 market dates, but noted some obstacles with Freedom Festival, road construction and vendor commitments to other markets in the area.

#### **Executive Director's Report**

## Race-for-the-Space

Knutson went through the decision process for choosing a new and existing business for Race-for-the-Space awards. He reported both Third Space Create and Downtown Dogs are engaged with their SCORE mentors and will provide a business update every month. Knutson feels it would be best to have Race-for Space every other year instead of annually.

#### **Downtown District Office**

In December, the subcommittee will meet to review how the downtown office is functioning in their current space at the Economic Alliance.

#### Marketing

- A robust and comprehensive marketing campaign is being planned for 2026.
- Social media posts featuring local bars/restaurants is being planned to help promote them during the slower winter months.
- Quarterly meetings are being set-up to collaborate with the City's retail consultant, David Connolly. A strategic plan is needed to lease retail and under-utilized street level spaces.
- A draft budget for 3<sup>rd</sup> St. activation plans will be presented to the Finance subcommittee soon.

### **Program Manager's Report**

# 4<sup>th</sup> Street Trail

Bassett reported significant hazards have been identified on the trail, especially between 1st and 2nd Avenue. The commission discussed the scope of repairs needed vs. the City's planned full reconstruction in a few years. Rings instructed Bassett to obtain quotes for aggregate slab repairs from A Avenue to 5<sup>th</sup> Avenue to address safety concerns in the interim for approximately two years. Hanlin suggested aligning with the City as to what their plans are.

## "Wow" Project

The Museum of Art is exploring art installation ideas for their empty parking lot behind their building. Bassett received a suggestion to place an art piece consisting of a large spoon filled with Crunch Berries for that space. Bassett said the museum may start a capital campaign.

## **Downtown Events & Programming**

- The allocated \$65K to events has been fully utilized, sponsoring 22 events (double from 2024).
- Planning winter window displays and a "Shop Local Downtown" promotion during Nov 15th Jan 31st.

#### **Placemaking**

New wayfinding/placemaking signage on 3rd Street is being considered and should align with the existing City guidelines. Wasta and Pratt made reference to something like this already exists but was not pursued, so Downtown staff will research. Rings would like directional signs explored further for the 4<sup>th</sup> St. trail between 1<sup>st</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> Avenue.

## Holiday Lights/Banners

- Bassett is proceeding with the holiday lights sponsorship expansion plan, including 20 additional trees near McGrath Amphitheater.
- Holiday banners to go up on poles the end of November.

## **Other**

- Façade improvement pending with GreatAmerica.
- Possibility of uplighting Smulekoff's building and/or Guaranty Bank.
- Bassett showed digital samples of sponsorship signs for the orange Cedar Rapids sign on May's Island.
- Bassett attended the IDA conference in Washington D.C.

#### **ACTION ITEMS**

- Knutson to confirm Juliet Pae-Corr (Fix Salon) owns her building.
- Knutson to work with Pratt about increasing the \$1000 sidewalk reimbursement amount.
- Basset to obtain quotes for aggregate slabs for 4th Street Trail.
- Contact media to share Downtown is at pre-pandemic numbers.
- Research/locate previously planned placemaking signage for downtown districts.
